Make sure they are clean Before storing winter clothes, make sure you wash or dry them. Make sure everything is completely dry before packing it away. Put ironAs attractive as attractive as it is, do not iron clothes that need to be stored and keep them away from starch. Both can weaken the fibers and make them prone to tearing along wrinkles. 3. Get the right boxes Store your clothes in plastic instead of wood, paper or cardboard boxes. It is waterproof and protects well from pests. Cardboard and wood contain chemicals that can migrate to clothes and damage them. Boxes can also become a home for pests that attract proteins in glue that holds them together. If you use plastic boxes, make sure they are not fully airtight, as some clothes (such as wool and other natural fibers) need to breathe.4. Keep cool Place the boxes or dishes in a cool place away from floor and moisture, sunlight and any heat.5. Keep away from wood Do not store clothes in direct contact with wood, as all wood contains acids that can damage textiles over a long period of time. 6. Beware of special itemsAdd articles should be wrapped in acidless tissue paper to prevent creasing and to increase protection. 7. Long-term thinking For long-term clothing storage such as wedding dresses, the best option is a special acid-free storage box - you can get these from filing experts such as memoryboxes.co.uk, viking-direct.co.uk or Amazon. If you store clothes for longer than one season, take them out once or twice a year and fold them again along different lines to prevent stress or tears at wrinkles. This is also a good way to check for damage. 8. Consider vacuum packsVacuum-packed bags can save space and protect objects from dirt, moisture, mould and bugs. The Department of Health and Human Services' Department of Aging and Adult Services enforces standards based on North Carolina's administrative law. These standards are summarized in this profile. Adult day health programs and programs that provide day health for adults in conjunction with adult day care must meet applicable state standards to qualify for Medicaid reimbursement funds. There are no additional requirements for a Medicaid provider besides certification standards. Licensing and certification requirements Definitions Adult day care refers to the provision of group care and supervision in a place other than its usual place of residence less than every 24 hours to adults who may be physically or mentally disabled. Adult Day Health Services is an organized service program during the day in a community group environment to support an adult's personal independence and promote social, physical and emotional well-being. Services shall include health services as defined in state standards and various programme actions aimed at meeting the individual needs and interests of participants and referral and assistance in the use of appropriate Community resources. Services must be provided in a home or center certified to meet state standards for such programs. Adult daycare centres can have a day care program for 2-6 people in one family apartment. Adult daycare centres may receive a daycare programme in a structure other than one family home. Adult day health centers and adult day health homes can maintain day health programs in a structure other than family housing, but day health programs for 2-5 people can work in one family home. Adult day health combination programs can work in both adult day care and adult day health in one program. At least 25% of those participating in the combination program daily have enrolled in adult daycare services. Special care services are services of a certified adult daycare home that promote themselves as providing programming, operation or treatment, in particular to persons with Alzheimer's disease or other dementia; mental health problems; or other specific needs, illnesses or circumstances as defined by the Medical Care Commission. Parameters for whom can be served general. Service providers must have specific registration policies so that they cannot register people whose actions designed for their needs cannot realistically be met. Policies should also provide for the dismissal of participants whose needs can no longer be met or who can no longer be safely managed. Service providers can serve both a half-ambulance and a non-ambulatory person. Adult day health programs have additional requirements. shall not re-register or serve persons whose program capabilities. Service providers may serve persons aged 18 or over who need day health services to support their independence and who need: 1) health surveillance, (2) the provision or supervision of daily vital activities (ADL), and (3) the provision of medicines, specialised feeding or other health care or services. Participants moving from standard day care services to specialised care services must meet the criteria of the special care service. Adult daycare and adult day care programmes shall be reviewed annually and monitored at least monthly to ensure compliance with the standards. The certificate shall be valid for 12 months from the date of issue, unless it is cancelled for a reason, terminated voluntarily or unintentionally or changed to a temporary certification status. After reviewing the certification application, staff from the State Department of Ageing and Adult Services can make an advance visit. Necessary and optional prescriptions for medicines Participants may keep and administer their own medicines when participating in a daycare programme. If a participant has decided not to be able to take charge of their medication, it shall be retained for him or her while the participant is present in the programme and shall be given by the healthcare coordinator at the specified time and at the same time. Provisions concerning staff requirements in need of special needs Type of staff. Adult day care and adult day health centres must have a full-time manager. Adult day health centers must have a health care coordinator (registered nurse (RN) or licensed local nurse (LPN) who is currently licensed to practice internships in North Carolina). If the healthcare coordinator is the LPN, the supervision must be carried out in accordance with the Care Practices Act and the RN's on-site monitoring must be carried out at least every two weeks. In adult day health centres with more participants, the director can also act as a health care coordinator. Adult daycare centres must have an operator. Personnel relations. The staff structure shall depend on the grounds for registration and the specific needs of the participants to be served. There shall be sufficient in terms of paid staff and participants to achieve the objectives and objectives of the Programme. The minimum ratios are as follows: Adult kindergartens - one employed employee for up to six participants. Adult kindergartens -- One paid employee for each of the eight participants. Adult Day Health Centers and Adult Day Health Homes -- One paid for full-time equivalent staff responsible for direct participant care for each of the five participants. Adult day health combination - One paid full-time equivalent staff member responsible for direct participant care for each of the six participants. Special care services - Adult Day the programme shall indicate in writing the procedures for the ratios of staff and participants in the special care service according to the needs of the participants. Training requirements Special care services. The adult day care programme providing specific services shall ensure that staff in specialised care services document the reception of training specific to the population or population to be provided; there shall be a written plan for the training of staff identifying the training content, sources,

assessments and timetables; ensure that, within one month of the employment relationship, each staff member assigned to the special maintenance services must demonstrate knowledge of the needs, interests and level of abilities of the participants; and ensure that, within six months of the employment relationship, each staff member assigned to special care must complete three training experiences, including, inter alia, population-specific communication, behavioural and ADL techniques. The adult daycare programme shall notify in writing the procedures concerning the amount and content areas of staff training, both on induction and annually on the basis of the special care needs of the participants. The adult day care programme providing specialised care services shall ensure that staff in specialised care services receive at least the following orientation and training: (1) the Programme Manager shall ensure that, within one month of the employment relationship, each staff assigned to the special care services must demonstrate knowledge of the needs, interests and level of abilities of the participants; (2) Within six months of the employment relationship, each staff member assigned to special care shall complete three training experiences, including, inter alia, population-specific communication, behavioural and ADL techniques; and (3) each staff member who works directly with participants in special care must complete at least two population-specific training experiences each year. Relevant Medicaid contract requirements for adult daytime service providers Adult day health programs and programs that provide day health for adults, together with adult day care, must be certified to meet these standards in order to receive Medicaid funds. The certification process is described in Section VI of standards for the certification of standards for day care and day health services for adults. Special care services. a daycare program that provides or advertises, markets or otherwise persons suffering from Alzheimer's disease or other dementia, mental health problems or other special needs, illness or illness shall be provided with written information to the ward and to persons seeking an adult daycare programme. Disclosure shall address the process and criteria for registering for and deciding on special maintenance services. Only programs that meet these requirements can advertise or represent themselves as providing specialized care services. However, an adult daycare programme that does not advertise, market or otherwise advertise itself as providing special care services to people with Alzheimer's disease or other dementia is not prohibited from providing adult day care services to people with Alzheimer's disease or other dementia, mental health problems or other special needs.
